

Generating Export Status Embryos

- * Donor animals must have been resident in UK for 6 months prior to collection
- * Donor animals must have been resident on the same UK holding for a period of 30 consecutive days prior to collection
- * For export to EU & N Ireland, donor animals must NEVER have been resident on a holding under TB restrictions (or Brucellosis or Enzootic Bovine Leukosis) at the time that such restrictions were in place
- * Donor animals must not have been resident in a herd with any clinical IBR or Infectious Pustular Vulvovaginitis in the 12 months prior to collection and should be free of clinical signs of disease at the time of collection
- * Donor animals should not be resident on a premises that is under veterinary prohibition or quarantine measures
- * Donors will almost certainly need to be blood tested. The testing requirements will vary with the intended country of export and are also subject to change with time. You will need to consult with us for confirmation of the testing requirements in place at the time of collection for your intended export destination



- * Semen straws used need to be export eligible & must have had their export status maintained throughout their lifetime
- * In practice, this can only be achieved if straws have **always** been held in licenced export status store. They must arrive with us direct from another export status store with their export status clearly declared
- * There are also additional requirements involved in the embryo production and storage processes, so we need to know well in advance if you plan to export your embryos
